Background

Consultant is to support NOACA in the development of a group Transit Asset Management (TAM) Plan pursuant to the FTA Final Rule on Transit Asset Management Plans for the Tier I and Tier II transit agencies within the NOACA planning area.

The rule requires FTA grantees to develop asset management plans for their public transportation assets, including vehicles, facilities, equipment, and other infrastructure.

NOACA is seeking to assist Tier I and Tier II service providers with this federal rule.



- NOACA issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Regional Transit Asset Management Plan on February 17th, closed April 7th, 2017
 - Three proposals were received
 - Proposals ranged from \$168,972 to \$296,027



- Vendors were scored on four criteria:
 - Project Approach
 - Experience
 - Qualifications
 - Cost





- AECOM Technical Services Inc. scored the highest and had the lowest cost at \$168,972.
 - Partnering with Raul V. Bravo + Associates, Inc. (RVB+A) who will complete 13.04% DBE


 Pending Board approval AECOM will begin work in July 2017 and complete by December 2018.
