Resolutions No. 2006-031 and 2006-032 RE: 8-Hour Ozone State Implementation Plan Recommendations

Dear Director Koncelik:

In accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding dated November 1, 2005, under which NOACA has acted as a § 174 agency under the federal Clean Air Act, enclosed please find the Resolutions of the NOACA Governing Board as they pertain to the 8-Hour Ozone State Implementation Plan that your office will be submitting to the United States Environmental Protection Agency in June 2007.

Resolution No. 2006-031, adopted August 11, 2006, sets forth 27 measures designed to bring Northeast Ohio into attainment by the federal deadline.

Resolution No. 2006-032, adopted August 11, 2006, expresses support for an extension of time on the federal deadline, if one could be achieved without redesignating the area to "serious nonattainment."

Background documents are also included, as noted at the end of this letter, based upon the 15 months of work performed by the NOACA Air Quality Public Advisory Task Force and the NOACA EAC Air Quality Subcommittee. Their work provided the basis on which the NOACA Governing Board has made these recommendations to your office.

The Board endorsed each Resolution unanimously, although there was considerable regarding the potential economic impact of the discussion We were assured by Bill Skowronski, recommendations on Northeast Ohio. Director, OEPA-NEDO, that your office takes economic impact into consideration in the promulgation of rules.

NOACA will be able to take the lead on the local programs and projects that are related to mobile sources. We look forward to being able to continue to assist in the greater effort of reaching attainment of the 8-Hour Ozone NAAQS in 2010.
